St. Pierre & Miquelon: Colonial Series Through First Pictorial Issue

Pre-stamp covers from St. Pierre and nearby French shore concession Newfoundland, French Colonials. General issue used at St. Pierre 1859 and the scarce `SPM` surcharges from 1885. Later ``tablet` type and `pictorial` stamp proofs, overprints, surcharges, varieties, issued stamps and postal usages on cover.

A postal history of New Westminster showing how the post office influenced and reflected the development of the city in the 20th century
